It should contain who, what, when & where and should provide a contact name, if appropriate. ALL Chapters must file an Interim Report ... If there is nothing to report, please so state.

New Faces, Old Favorites to Grace MOTM's Beach Stage

It was this week in 1977 that a country singer seeking to make a name for himself hit his career peak on the Billboard Hot 100 with a song about a tropical drinking binge and a lost shaker of salt. How amazing is it that 45 years later, a Buffetinspired artist named Niko Moon is again bringing our music to the top of the charts. Niko hit the top number one on the country charts in 2021 with his hit single "Good Time," the music video viewed over 50 million times. And he's just getting started. Following his success as a songwriter,

having penned several Zac Brown tunes, Niko's song and album "Good Time" marked his entry into the world of performing, and he's generating a lot of buzz



with his beach and summer-themed music. His first of two summer EP releases Coastin' debuted at Number 3 last month on the I-Tunes Country Chart, with the first single "Easy Tonight" leading the way and cracking the Radio Margaritaville playlist.

What's even cooler is that the guy taking trop rock back to the top of the charts is among the headliners at the 30th Annual Meeting of the Minds, brought to you by Margaritaville Island Reserve Resorts. The 30th Anniversary edition of the Parrot Heads in Paradise Convention is shaping up as the epic celebration that it ought to be, coming up November 2-6 in Key West.

Niko is one of three national headlining acts that will take the <u>MyWorldMeds.com</u> Beach Stage on Friday night, joined by first-time MOTMers The Wheeland Brothers, with the rising stars sandwiching the legendary Mac McAnally, and Chicago's Johnny Russler and the Beach Bum Band kicking off the Beach Stage festivities Friday afternoon.

World Music Saturday night's blockbuster beach stage lineup features an unabridged Coral Reefer Band, featuring Club Trini and guest vocalist John Frinzi. The Reefers will be preceded earlier in the day by full band sets from faves Donny

Brewer and Thom
Shepherd and then
surrounded by some
of the biggest names of
the 21st century in
reggae music. With an
astonishing five
Billboard Number One
albums, Mishka will
set the tone for the



evening, and following the Coral Reefers performance, Grammy winner Gramps Morgan and his band will bring it home with "positive vibration" on the final night of the event.

Thursday night beach stage sounds will include the brilliant songwriting and harmonies of the Gainesville-based Sister Hazel, recognized by the Margaritaville Blog as one of about a dozen acts that you must see in live performance, and the great guitar work and vocals of the Peter Mayer Group, with the two headliners wrapped on both ends by two of the most popular Buffett/Trop rock cover bands on earth, Jimmy and the Parrots and Gary & The Landsharks, making their first return trip to MOTM since they were joined by Buffett himself in an impromptu street concert in Old Town at the first Key West MOTM in 1998.

Opening night Wednesday highlights some of the best female songwriters in the phamily with Coley McCabe's Girls Just Wanna Have Rum, featuring Coral Reefer Nadirah Shakoor, reigning TRMA Female Vocalist Erica Sunshine Lee, longtime Parrot Head fave Heather Vidal and rising star Claire Wright. They'll be preceded by Desperadoes, an Eagles Tribute fronted by TRMA Entertainer of the Year Donny Brewer and Male Vocalist of the Year Mike Nash. And of course, the beach stage festivities, in accord with MOTM tradition, begin with the legendary James "Sunny Jim" White.

There's lots more music at MOTM22, including dozens of singer-songwriters featured at the Lighthouse Songwriter Showcase with host Kelly McGuire, broadcast on Songwriters

Island Radio and presented by Margaritaville Vacation Club. And for the first time, Pirates and Poets present four songwriter showcases, two each on



Wednesday and Sunday, the latter leading to the grand finale of the 30th MOTM, which ends as the first one began - with Jerry Diaz and Scott Nickerson singing a Buffett song. Jerry and Scott will close it out on the Pier Stage overlooking the water where the Atlantic Ocean meets the Gulf of Mexico.

Rooms at the Casa Marina sold out almost instantly when registration opened in March, but there are about ten remaining ocean-facing luxury rooms and suites remaining as part of the VIP Room Bundles, which include one VIP admission, a special VIP gift bag, access to a VIP lounge and on-site and a choice of one of three themed morning breakfast cruises. Thursday's cruise features a unique cover-to-cover performance of Jesse Rice's soon-to-be-released and longawaited Pirate Sessions V record. Friday's Funny Fellas Floatin' cruise features lots of laughs with Bill Whyte, Brent Burns, and Stoney Gabel. And Saturday's Trop Rockin' Tomorrow showcase cruise features young trop rockers Claire Wright, Bryton Stolls, Godiva and Isabella Stefania.

- Scrolling Slideshows exist and will be used to highlight sponsors and advertisers along with PHIP club awards (ie. club of the month, golden coconut, ... etc.) and special PHIP activities/events.

- A new PHIP google calendar will be frequently updated with new and upcoming major chapter events channeled through the Regional Coordinators. Clubs can provide content to their RC's to be placed on this calendar for major yearly events. This is another way to aid in increasing member engagement and help entice new club membership and registration.
- Another page section contains posts from the PHIP Board members used to raise awareness and attention to breaking news, random announcements, events and activities concerning all Parrot Head Chapter members.

Future planned updates:

 A new on-line form has been developed to streamline the process of submitting the mid-year club information to PHIP. Part of this form will allow clubs to voluntarily provide a copy of their current club roster in hopes to provide insight to further aid in streamlining the submission of the yearly club registration, payment and membership information.

- A "Members Only" section with login and user accounts.
 This section will be driven by the membership rosters provided by clubs during the mid-year submission and the yearly club registration. Clubs providing membership rosters will inadvertently be providing advanced access to their club members to be invited to enter the members only section of the website that will contain special privileges and member benefits (to be announced by the PHIP board sometime in the near future).
- The ability for local clubs to host their websites for free (as subdomains under the PHIP domain) and obtain commonly used WordPress plugins for site development and maintenance.
- NOTE: Announcements detailing the specifics concerning PHIP website hosting for the chapters will be emailed to the club leaders around the August/September timeframe.
- Provide a better interface when viewing the site from your mobile or tablet. Currently some of the sections may be a bit cumbersome when viewing by phone but this is currently being addressed to result in a pleasant user experience whether accessing the site via laptop or mobile.
- Establish a website working group and support team to support local clubs with website creation and maintenance. An imminent goal is to provide local clubs with solutions and suggestions to help build their social platforms and website presence to engage existing members and also lure new membership.

- * Many clubs don't enter because they think it's based on membership or fundraising numbers.

NOT TRUE!!

Here are a few hints that might help:

1. **BE CREATIVE!!** (if it looks boring & not fun to read and it really has nothing but fundraising figures, it's probably going to get a low score). Make it fun to read! We know you all are creative out there! You show your creativity in your concert attire, tailgating, event decorations and events! Put that same creativity to paper!!

2. Read last year's winning essay, as well as previous winning essays!! They are posted at: http://www.phip.com/club-winners.

Use their creativity as a Guideline!

- 3. You can't win if you don't enter!! The Golden Coconut Award is like winning the Lottery of PHIP and gives your club membership into a very unique and small group of Clubs who use their win to their advantage! You have bragging rights to use on your website, on your club merchandise! You know you love to talk about your club to anyone who will listen!! Imagine telling a potential sponsor of your event or club that *your* club is a Golden Coconut Winner and then explaining what it stands for!! We know you can be loud & proud.. put that spirit down on paper!!
- **4. Follow the rules!!** Yes, we gotta have some stinkin' rules ... (as all contests do, see sidebar to right).
- 5. Don't have time to write a blind essay to submit?? I would be willing to bet that you have someone in your club who is a creative writer! Tap them as a resource!! There is NO rule that the Golden Coconut must be written by a Club's Officer, the GC just needs to be submitted by the club's contact!! Sometimes a member who would love to contribute in some way just needs to be asked!
- 6. Every chapter, with the exception of previous Golden Coconut recipients from 2017 to 2021, regardless of size or age, has an equal opportunity to win this most coveted designation!

Onboard they were entertained by Jim Asbell, Paul and Kristie Bobal, Barefoot Reggie Starrett, Scott Kirby, Brendan Mayer, and Peter Mayer. The Parrothead Cruise is a party with a purpose, raising over \$10,100 for breast cancer. To date, the Parrothead Cruises have raised over \$330,000 for charity.

Atlanta Parrot Head Club is already looking forward to Parrothead Cruise 2023. Over 300 people are already signed up to be gypsies in the palace as they sail aboard the Norwegian Escape in March of 2023 heading to the Dominican Republic, St. Thomas, Tortola and the Bahamas. Onboard they'll be entertained by Brent Burns, Drop Dead Dangerous, Barefoot Reggie Starrett and Three Boat Drunks (Dyke, Mike and Howie). Registration is open now. Beating the Heat with a Purpose

Yes, it's hot in Texas, but not too hot for San Antonio PHC to help a variety of community organizations. In April, their charity of the month was the Battered Women's Shelter, and \$600 worth of hygiene items and clothes for children were collected and donated.

In May, they held their annual beach weekend event, "Survive" at Port Aransas at the coast on May 19-20 and raised \$800 for the Alzheimer's Association and \$1,000 for the Amos Rehabilitation Keep, an animal rescue organization for coastal and sea life.

In June, they collected 25 box fans worth \$625 for Project Cool, a United Way program to provide fans for elderly, had 26 members worked at the San Antonio Food Bank filling boxes and had had 14 members volunteer at their quarterly highway cleanup along a designated 2 mile stretch of road on N.W. Military Highway.

New Smyrna Beach PHC had a House Concert with Jimi Pappas and a 50/50 for "Cudas Unhooked" They Support the Homeless Teens in our area to get thru High School and some even move on to College.

The Parrot Head Club of Eastern Mass. volunteered at the Special Olympics in Barnstable on May 14th and 22nd handing out medals and smiles all day long. They were then asked to dress in Disney finest and DJ and host the dance for over 500 Special Olympic athletes at their dance June 11th.

Coastal Jersey Parrot Head Club once again supported the local American Cancer Society Relay for Life of Northern Ocean County on June 10. After a 2 year in person shut down because of covid restrictions, everyone was happy to be back on grounds at Windward Beach Park in Brick NJ. Their team raised over \$3000 online in donations.

Padre Island PHC of Corpus Christi held Beach Bash 2022 "Live Like Jimmy Buffett" with Music, Food, Fun on and at the Beach; a Silent Auction of donated items and a Booze Wagon Raffle. After the event a \$4500 check presentation was made to the Texas Sealife Center.

Central Oklahoma Parrothead Association raised \$3500 for Roatan Children's Ministry and packaged 7150 equivalent meals at the local food bank.

PHlock of South Jersey had a beach clean up in Brigatine, NJ on April 9th and sent sent \$500.00 to our local charity, Camp No Worries, a camp held every year for children with cancer.




