The Savannah PHC wanted to pay tribute to Jimmy with a musical tribute and, of course a fundraiser. I contacted several musicians that are in our club, and they were all in for a charity gig, and our BOD was in for a fundraiser for Alzheimer's. We have a member who is now in the later stages of the disease. He was a great contributor to the club over the last 15 years. In addition, we know that Alzhiemer's is a favored charity for PH Clubs. We set an aggressive date of September 10th to make this happen on Tybee Island, Georgia.

We hit the local social media, radio stations and our mailing list to get the word out for Parrotheads to be at the Cockspur Grill at 2PM for "Tailgate" and 3PM for music. We also went to the local Landshark Distributer who donated some items for our raffle. In the end we had about 12 raffle baskets.

Come Sunday morning, September 10th, we had the Cockspur outside patio decorated as a tropical paradise. The music was supposed to start at 3PM, but people started showing up at noon. We literally had people tailgating in the parking lot with lawn chairs and coolers. By 2PM it was standing room only. We started the music early to a crowd of about 150 people outside and about 70 inside the restaurantwhere the music was piped in on the house sound system.

Included in the decorations were handmade floral decorations that were made by one of our members fighting breast cancer. We sold these and the money raised was donated to the local breast cancer fund.

We raised over \$3,000 for

Alzheimer's that day. Every one had a fantastic time and at 6:00PM we still had a crowd to hear Jimmy sing "Bubbles Up" followed by the band playing Margaritaville one more time.

We have a small club here in Savannah and our team did a fantastic job of getting this Tribute done as I believe Jimmy would want it.

Canada's oldest Parrot Head Club, the Calgary Parrot Head Club, held its annual golf tournament on Saturday, September 16 at Crystal Ridge golf course. This was the third year that the tournament raised money for the local charity: Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids (BB4CK). Sadly, over 7,000 children in Calgary go to school daily without lunch. BB4CK packs that many lunches each school day and delivers them to the schools. The support from the Calgary Parrot Head Club will go a long way to helping them with this very important work.

This has to be the most colorful golf tournament in the Calgary area. We have prizes for 'Best Dressed" players and "Best Decorated Cart". It's always fun to see how creative the group can be.

The tournament winner is awarded the GREAT WHITE CUP. Second only in importance to the Stanley Cup, this trophy rewards the foursome with the lowest score the recognition of being The Champion Golfers in Canada.....well, kind of. This year the Rob M team were the winners.

The Calgary Parrot Heads celebrate honesty, integrity and modesty perhaps even more than we celebrate golfing excellence with the awarding of THE LANDSHARK CUP. This is awarded to the Most Honest Team. The 2023 winners were the Bruce M foursome.

Fortunately, we had a number of generous sponsors this year so that more than half of the 40 golfers in the tournament walked away with a prize. The biggest winner however was our charity, BB4CK. We were able to raise \$1,500 for them . A local foundation will match that donation so BB4CK will get \$3,000 in support.

Parrot Heads In Natural Settings (PHINS), held its annual golf tournament in April of this year at World Golf Village in St. Augustine. We were able to raise \$13,000 for Dreams Come True, which was presented to them at our club's birthday party in July.

The Phlock of South Jersey gave Unforgotten Haven Food Bank in Camden, NJ 100.00 worth of food in July. Maple Shade Congregational Church Food Bank 150.00 in July and 140.00 in August, and we donated \$500.00 in September to Singing for Change in memory of Jimmy.

Pirates of the Northwoods held a fundraising event selling soup for FestiFall in Lakewood WI and raised just over \$1,000 to be donated to the local food pantry.

The Parrot Heads of Central Florida held a 'Celebrating the Life, Songs, and Stories' PHlocking on September 15th at The Porch-Winter Park. Our PHounder, Jim Schlegel, reminded us as to how few of us would ever have encountered one another, if not for all that Jimmy gave to us. Jim led us in a 'tribute toast' to the Grand Parrothead and we did our best to 'keep the party going!'

The Key West Parrot Head Club was out in force at the inaugural "Second Line" memorial procession in memory of Jimmy Buffett 3 September 2023. The event was planned and coordinated by local rum maker Paul Menta in just 16 hours. Over 3000 people were in attendance. Mark your calendars because it is now an annual event every September 1st.

The Alzheimer's Association has long been the leading voice on behalf of people living with this fatal disease. The Association believes that these people deserve the opportunity to discuss and choose, with their doctors and family, whether an approved treatment is right for them. This discussion should take place with as few barriers as possible.

Most of the Walks for Alzheimer's around the country are over, but we still have a few more to go. As a reminder, anyone may give to you or your team up to December 31, 2023, and it will count for this year. I have had people say, "Sorry I forgot to give to your efforts on your walk" and I respond to them "You may give to the end of the end of the year. It's a nice tax incentive.

Our efforts (Parrot Head Clubs around the country) have been a huge success. We raised \$104,969.00 so far this year, surpassing our 2023 goal of \$100,000.00. (Thank you!) It's been a good year nationally for getting out and "Partying with a Purpose." That was accomplished with 43 teams (clubs) participating, and over 300 Parrotheads walking in live walks around the country.

Again, thank you to all for your efforts in the fund raising and awareness of Alzheimer's with the hope to have a cure for this terrible disease.
